Attendance

School attendance is vital for pupil's development physically, emotionally and socially. It is important that your child attends every day and on time.

Children should only be kept at home if they have a serious illness or injury. If this is the case, parents must call the school by 9.00am.

Every effort should be made to make dental, clinic or hospital appointment outside of school hours, however if you cannot then children should attend school before/after their appointment and provide medical evidence so that this absence can be authorised.

Pupils should miss as little time as possible - every learning opportunity matters!

The school will implement strategies in order to improve attendance for any child whose absence is falling below 96%, who has a pattern of erratic attendance, or persistent lateness. Behaviour

The support of all parents on all matters concerning school is invaluable. This support is important in ensuring a positive, well-ordered working environment, which all parents would wish for their children. The aim of the school with regard to discipline is that children should develop self-discipline and understand the need for self-control. It is hoped that unacceptable behaviour will be rare. If there is concern over unacceptable behaviour, parents will be consulted and asked to co-operate with any measure deemed necessary. The school recognises that parents are responsible for the discipline of their children and expects them to play an active part in ensuring their child's good behaviour whilst at school. In accepting a place for your child at St. Teresa's it is essential that parents respect the authority of the Headteacher and staff and trust their judgements in relation to matters of discipline.

Homework

We ask that all parents support their children by listening and helping them to read regularly, (at least 3 times per week), informing the class teacher if they have any concerns. Parents' support in helping their children learn multiplication tables (Times Tables Rockstars) and weekly spellings (Spelling Shed) thoroughly, would greatly benefit the children. In each KS2 class, the teacher will provide your child work to complete at home, these tasks will be mainly Maths and English based.

School Meals

A choice of good quality cooked meals is available, these are freshly prepared each day by our on-site catering team. Parents of children with specific dietary requirements should inform the school. Free school meals application information is available from the school website for parents in receipt of Income Support. If pupils bring packed lunches it is important that they are both nourishing and of sufficient quantity to enable the child to work well throughout the afternoon. Please note we are a **nut-free site**, also fizzy drinks and chocolate (other than a chocolate biscuit) are not permitted. Parents must pre-order their child's meal at least one day before via our ParentPay app. Parents/Carers will be issued with log on details. Dinners are currently £2.30 per day for Juniors. Infant children are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal. To view the current menu please click here



Pupil Premium

Pupil premium is additional funding given to school for extra support and to help close the attainment gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupils. Please read the information within the Pupil Premium statement on the website which gives details of our Pupil Premium Grant and how we allocate the funding. The Pupil Premium Grant is a sum of money that is allocated to school to ensure that all children have an equal chance to succeed. Your child may qualify for Pupil Premium. Wrap Around Care

Our Breakfast and After School Club is run by our own members of staff. We operate between the hours of 7.55am – 8.40am and 3.15pm -6.00pm during term time. This also includes our Pre-School children. Parents have the option to join a contract for regular sessions which we then guarantee on a month-to-month basis. Ad hoc sessions are also available subject to availability.
