



## Sports Premium Statement 2016 – 2017

Amount Allocated: £9400

Our vision at St Teresa's Catholic Primary School is to use our School Sports Premium to create a culture that encourages all children to be active and have a positive attitude towards physical activities and healthy lifestyles. We will be using our funding this year to continue to develop our teachers to teach high quality PE and to offer a good level of competitive sports in our school. We will also be participating in a greater number of competitive sports in the local community.

Our funding has been/ will be targeted in the following ways for this academic year:

Purchase of sporting equipment	10%	<p>Class set of footballs – to enable all pupils within a class to develop their football skills.</p> <p>Ball Pumps – to ensure upkeep and maintenance of equipment.</p> <p>Tag Ruby Velcro Tags for a whole class</p> <p>Rounders balls – to replace lost/damaged</p> <p>Small softer balls for KS1 so the children become more confident in throwing and catching and less intimidated by the size.</p> <p>Tennis Rackets – We have seen an increased interest in the juniors for Tennis so there will be a greater focus on this in the summer term.</p> <p>Painting of lines for Sports Day and the purchase of stickers for KS1 and FS2 to encourage a fun and competitive element.</p> <p>Ongoing maintenance of PE equipment as and when required.</p>
Replacement of outdoor storage boxes	3%	<p>This extra storage has provided us with the much needed space to keep some of our sports equipment next to the all-weather surface pitch, which gives an ease of access for staff and pupils. Unfortunately the originals were damaged during a storm and have had to be replaced.</p>
Cover for the PE co-ordinator to be released from class to attend sporting competitions such as netball, cross country and football.	10%	<p>We have continued taking part in sports competitions throughout the school in Football, Netball and Cross Country. This continues our development with other local schools and communities and increases our participation rates in competitive sports.</p>

Support for Teaching staff to encourage differentiation and extending our high ability sporting children.	70%	<p>We have employed a new PE Teaching Assistant to assist with the teaching of PE during class time alongside the class teacher. This enables us to teach high level PE but also to extend the high ability sporting children.</p> <p>With our PE Teaching Assistant we are able to offer a wider range of sporting activities which are additional to the school day.</p> <p>As our PE TA is a cricket coach and plays competitively he will be raising the profile of cricket across the school during the summer term and sharing his expertise with teaching staff.</p> <p>Employing a PE TA also enables us to attend more sporting events during the school day which might not be possible otherwise.</p>
Dance Lessons for Upper KS2 classes	2%	<p>We have used a professional dance teacher to work with the children to create specific dance sequences alongside the class teachers. Our aim is to develop the children's movement and performance skills and to break down the barriers and inhibitions for all children.</p>
Purchase of PE scheme of work for KS1 and KS2	4%	<p>This was purchased to ensure consistency and the appropriate development of skills across the school. Teachers have become more confident in the planning and delivery of lessons as a result. The children have enjoyed taking part in a range of activities and have been more engaged.</p> <p>Our aim is to use this scheme to ensure a more focused approach to assessment of the key skills and fitness levels.</p>
